The Bible teaches us very clearly that it is wise to seek counsel because those who do so get understanding and wisdom which are qualities that are imperative for success. This lab should be approached with a serious mind. Not only do we get our counsel from the Word of God, but we get it from other wise people. It is best for the Christian to have a cabinet of counselors with whom they counsel on a regular basis. By seeking counsel properly, you will also equip yourself with the ability and wisdom to help counsel others. Jesus was a counselor as were many of the other great leaders in the Bible. Let us approach these projects with sober thinking and purpose of heart.

**Class Assignments:** You are to seek counsel in the following ways. Seek counsel from your pastor or a church staff member. Be sure your counselor is an older, wiser person. Utilize saved and godly parents in some way if possible.

1. Seek some type of financial counsel.
2. Seek some type of counsel regarding a church ministry in which you participate.
3. Seek some type of prayer counsel.
4. Some type of Bible counsel regarding an Old Testament verse.
5. Seek some type of Bible counsel regarding a New Testament verse.
6. Seek some type of Bible counsel regarding a verse in the book of Proverbs.
7. Seek some type of relationship counsel.
8. Seek some type of problem solving counsel.
9. Seek some type of success counseling.
10. Seek some type of attitude counseling.
11. Seek some type of work related counseling.
12. Seek some type of counseling about a personal weakness you have.
13. Seek some type of counsel about a spiritual goal you have for yourself.
